#### **Athletics**

The girl's and boy's hockey seasons have come to a close. The boy's had a strong showing in their playoff games, finishing with 3 competitive playoff games against much higher seeded opponents.

The girl's hockey team finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the capital region, and won their provincial qualifier vs Parkview earning the right to play at this past weekend's SSNS girl's high school hockey provincials for the first time since 2010-2011.

The boy's and girls' basketball seasons have come to a close. Both the boy's and girl's had successful seasons, with the girl's capping off their season with a tournament win at the North South Challenge hosted by Yarmouth Consolidated High School.
